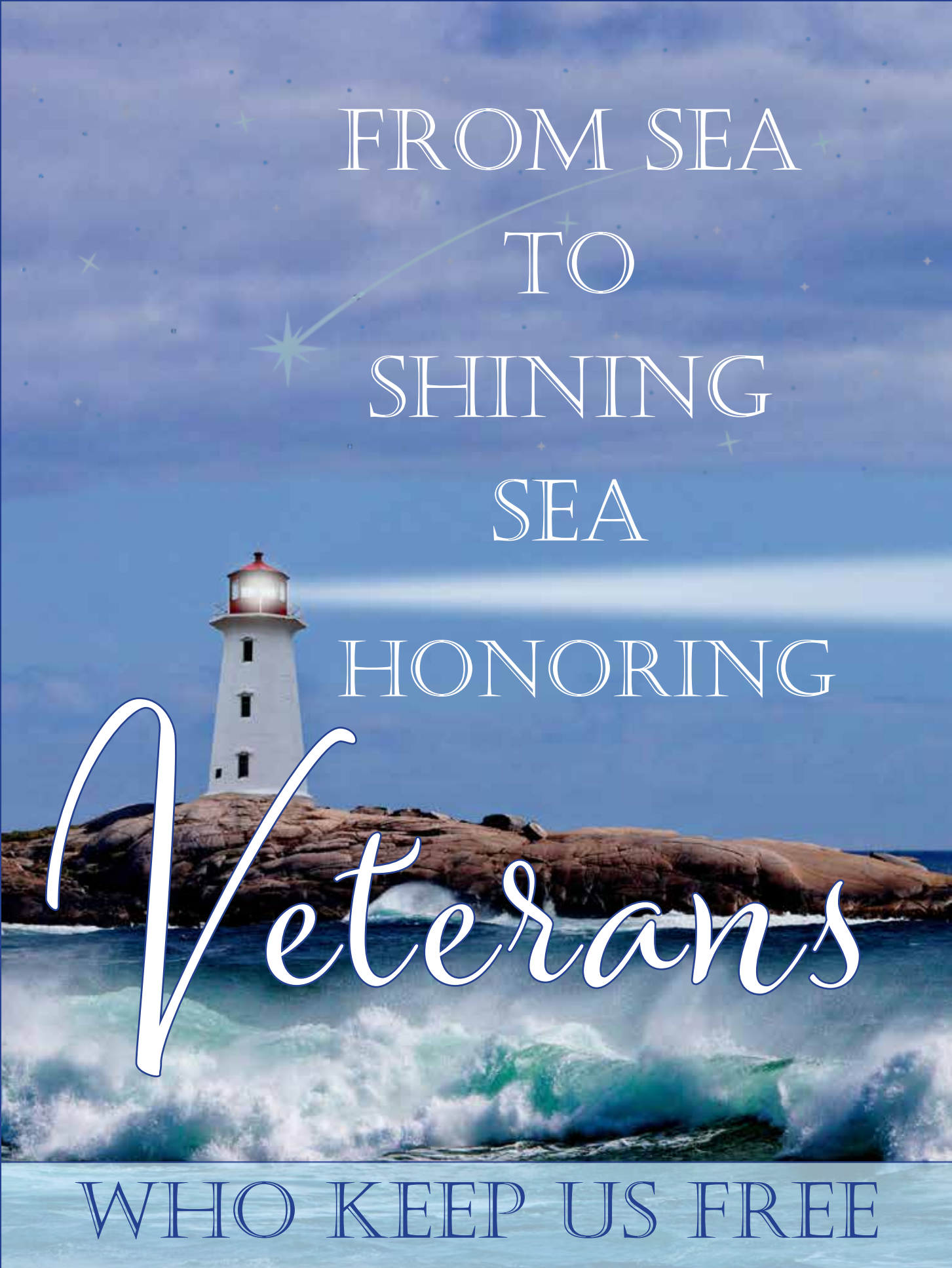

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CIRCLE OF EXCELLENCE

Every Department has the opportunity to join the Circle of Excellence. The criteria are listed below. National Headquarters will track this information. Consider this a checklist for the Program Year of important items and deadlines that must be met. Membership is an important factor and will be encouraged by the Conference Membership Coaches, who will be working with Department Membership Chairmen to achieve the membership portion of the Circle of Excellence criteria. Log into your MALTA Profile, Duties, Circle of Excellence to complete your criteria form. **Your Department MUST achieve 250 points or more to enter the Circle of Excellence.**

Criteria for entering the Circle of Excellence:

1. Growth in Membership:

Membership Standings by June 30, 2026 based on June 30, 2025 final membership statistics. Membership will be based on figures listed on the CMR - Paid, Canceled & Deceased report in MALTA.

Possible Points	Actual Points	Criteria
110		Over 101% in membership, not including deaths (current percent)
100		100% Plus in membership, not including deaths (current percent)
90		100% Plus in membership, including paid deaths (paid percent)
80		97-100% in membership, including paid deaths (paid percent)

2. Comply with Bylaws/Administrative Follow-Through:

A) All installation reports MUST be received at National Headquarters by July 31. If not, the Department MUST submit a request for a suspension by that date for time to mentor and rejuvenate the Auxiliary.

10		Installation report received at National Headquarters by July 31.
5		Suspension report received at National Headquarters by July 31.

B) All Auxiliaries MUST be bonded by August 31. If not, the Department MUST submit a request for a suspension by that date to allow time to mentor and rejuvenate the Auxiliary.

10		All Auxiliaries bonded by August 31 or request for suspension.
5		Suspension report received at National Headquarters by August 31.

C) The Department MUST have submitted a Council-approved audit and budget by October 1 or request an extension on or before that date. Once extension is met, points will be awarded.

D) Department, District and Auxiliary Officers (Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurers) dues MUST be paid by December 31 or submit an email or letter to relieve any non-paid Officers to National Headquarters by January 5.

10		Dues of Officers at all levels paid by December 31 or email or letter to relieve non-paid Officers to Headquarters by January 5.

Criteria for entering the Circle of Excellence (continued):

- E) The Department MUST have submitted the names of their VAVS Representatives to National or request an extension on or before July 31.

- F) Auxiliaries must have 10 paid members by February 1.

3. Department Communication:

- A) The Department MUST communicate with every Auxiliary at least quarterly in one or more of the following ways: email, mail, phone, website, newsletter, E-Newsletter or General Orders.

- B) The Department Chairman of each National Program MUST send at least four (4) promotionals and/or communications to their National Ambassador by April 30. 10 points for submitting four (4), 15 points for submitting six (6).

4. Training:

The Department MUST hold at least one training session* on each of the following:

**Training session can take place at a Department School of Instruction, meeting, Convention or other organized training events. These trainings can be combined into one session.*

- A) How to Identify an Unhealthy Auxiliary

5. Programs Participation and Working Together on a Common Goal:

A) The Department MUST complete and submit the online Year-End Report.

B) What did your Department do to engage every Auxiliary in the work of the organization?

C) All Auxiliaries MUST complete at least one project, activity or donation that benefits veterans by April 30.

10		All Auxiliaries MUST complete at least one project, activity or donation that benefits veterans by April 30. If not, the Department MUST contact the Auxiliary by that date for explanation.

D) The Department must hold a joint VFW and VFW Auxiliary Department-level project in addition to current National Scholarships programs. Project must be completed by April 30.

E) Any Auxiliary that is below 100% in membership on January 31. MUST be contacted by a Department Officer to determine a need for mentoring and/or other assistance. The Department Officer must contact the Auxiliary on or before April 15. The Department Officer must then report to the Department President by April 30.

(If all Auxiliaries and Districts in your Department are at 100% on January 31, you will automatically receive 10 points.)

The National Program Ambassadors of each Program listed will select the recipients. Department Program Chairmen will be judged on quality, creativity and originality of all communications, promotions and events. When a Department Program Chairman does anything to promote or publicize the Program to the members and the community, they should send a copy of the item or communication or a description of the event or presentation to the National Program Ambassador.

Required to qualify:

The Department Program Chairman must have sent a minimum of four (4) mailed and/or emailed promotions to the members in their Department and must send copies to the National Ambassador by April 30, 2026.

Winners will be announced, and awards will be presented at the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention. If neither the winner nor Department leadership are in attendance, awards will be mailed to recipients from VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters upon return from the VFW Auxiliary National Convention.

Respect For Our Flag

Patriotism begins at home. Let's show our patriotism this year and love for the American Flag. Many years ago, when joining the VFW Auxiliary, it reaffirmed my love for this country. It made me proud to be an American, flying the American Flag and seeing the flags on the Auxiliary meeting floor. Every time I march in, carrying the American Flag, I was walking with my head up and proud.

Americanism is an unfailing love of country, loyalty to its institutions and ideas, a desire to secure the blessing of liberty and posterity and an undivided allegiance to the Flag.

As a member of the Auxiliary, it is our duty to show our patriotism by supporting veterans, their families, volunteering in our communities, promoting patriotism and flying the American Flag.

Honoring and respecting the American Flag is significant for several reasons. It is a tribute to the sacrifices and service our veterans made, and it is a symbol of our national unity and identity.

I'm A Proud American. Why are you a proud American? How do we show our pride in America? Who are the proud Americans? Show Your Patriotism.

Flag Education

Organize educational programs and workshops within your community to teach the proper etiquette for displaying and handling the American Flag. Partner with local schools, civic organizations and other groups to spread awareness about the significance of the Flag and its role in American history.

Establish a program for the respectful disposal of worn or damaged Flags. Set up collection points at local VFW posts or partner with other organizations to ensure that old Flags are properly retired according to the guidelines outlined by the U.S. Flag Code.

Promote Patriotism

Patriotic Symbols and Traditions: Educate others about the meaning and importance of patriotic symbols and traditions, including the American Flag, the National Anthem and the Pledge of Allegiance. Share tips on how to properly display and honor these symbols in daily life.

Spotlight on National Holidays: Provide information and ideas for celebrating national holidays like Memorial Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day. Include tips on how to organize and participate in local observances that reflect the significance of these holidays.

POW/MIA Remembrance

Prisoner of War (POW) and Missing in Action (MIA) Remembrance Day is a solemn occasion dedicated to honoring the bravery and sacrifice of those who have endured captivity or remain unaccounted for while serving our nation. This day is crucial for recognizing the profound hardships faced by POWs, who suffered extreme conditions and personal anguish while separated from their loved ones. It also highlights the ongoing commitment

to account for those who are still missing, ensuring that their sacrifices are never forgotten. By observing this day, we reaffirm our collective responsibility to remember these heroes, support their families and uphold the values of honor and respect for all who have served in the defense of freedom.

Importance of Patriotic Instruction

The Patriotic Instructor is responsible for educating members about the history, symbolism and proper etiquette related to American patriotic symbols, particularly the American Flag. This education helps members understand the significance of these symbols and how to honor them appropriately. By sharing discussions, focused on Americanism in your Auxiliary meeting, the Patriotic Instructor can teach others to foster a deeper appreciation for the values and traditions that the VFW Auxiliary stands for. This role is crucial in promoting patriotism and ensuring that members uphold the principles of respect and honor for the nation.

Tools

Social Media Campaigns: Use social media platforms to share stories, events and patriotic messages. Use the current hashtags associated with the VFW Auxiliary to show other members how your Auxiliary is promoting patriotism. #AuxiliaryPatriotism.

Program QR Codes

QR Codes are used on just about everything. Members can use it as a talking point to explain about the VFW Auxiliary Americanism and patriotism. Most people will open it up and then they can find important information on the Americanism Program.





AMERICANISM PROGRAM

Flag Education • Promote #AuxiliaryPatriotism • POW/MIA Recognition • Star Family Recognition

The following definition of “Americanism” was originated by the Commanders-in-Chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, United Spanish War Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, the National Commanders of the American Legion and the Disabled American Veterans of the World War at a conference held in Washington, D.C., in February 1927:

“Americanism is an unfailing love of country; loyalty to its institutions and ideals; eagerness to defend it against all enemies; undivided allegiance to the Flag; and a desire to secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and posterity.”

Patriotic Instructors/Americanism Chairman

The Patriotic Instructor educates members about the proper salute to the U.S. Flag, as well as the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance. They also take the time to understand the VFW Auxiliary Ritual and the Federal Flag Code. They help members to understand the traditions and ceremonies of the organization. The *Understanding Auxiliary Traditions* help sheet and video are available in MALTA Member Resources.

Flag Education

A large part of demonstrating Americanism and patriotic spirit is respecting and properly caring for the U.S. Flag. Flag etiquette covers everything from proper display of our Flag to acceptable conduct around this symbol of our nation.

Respect for the Flag - Engaging the Community

- Flag Education in Schools – Educating our youth about patriotism is an important step on the path to good citizenship. Encourage members of your Auxiliary to volunteer in schools and educate youth about the importance of respecting our Flag. Volunteers can visit individual classrooms or give a presentation at a school assembly. For more resources, see MALTA Member Resources.
- Recognition of Outstanding Community Flag Display – When a community member, business or organization takes the care and time to display our “Stars and Stripes,” it reinforces patriotism to the entire community. You may recognize this display of patriotism by presenting a certificate of appreciation from your Auxiliary.
- Flag Retirement Ceremonies – These ceremonies honoring our Flag serve as one of the most beautiful forms of respect for our country. This is the perfect way to involve the whole family of Auxiliary and VFW members. Flag retirement ceremonies can also serve as an event involving the entire community.
- Promote Patriotism – Celebrating Patriotic Holidays. Patriotic holidays are an opportune time to involve the whole family and bring community attention to your Auxiliary. Patriotic holidays and days of note can serve as the perfect way to show that your Auxiliary supports patriotism, veterans and their families as a top priority. Entry form is required and available in MALTA Member Resources.

VFW Auxiliaries must send the required entry form to the Department Americanism Chairman by March 31, 2026 for judging.

The Department Americanism Chairman must sign and send a copy of the completed Department-winning entry form to the National Americanism Ambassador by April 30, 2026 for judging.

Citations will be mailed directly to winning VFW Auxiliaries from National Headquarters and money will be deposited into the VFW Auxiliary account after the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention.

Awards for Departments and Department Chairmen:

1. \$25 VFW Store gift certificate to one Department Americanism Chairman in each of the 10 Program Divisions who demonstrates exceptional dedication and creativity in promoting the proper display and respect for the American Flag during VFW Auxiliary meetings.

Winners will be announced and awards will be presented at the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah.

2. The Outstanding Performance Award and Second-Place Outstanding Performance Award will be awarded in each of the 10 Program Divisions based on the criteria listed on page 5 and for the promotion of the Program goals listed at the top of page 9.

Winners will be announced and awards will be presented at the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Since 1914, the VFW Auxiliary has united individuals from all walks of life with a common purpose: to improve the lives of veterans, service members, their families and our **COMMUNITIES**.

Auxiliary Outreach is all about what we can do to help our **communities**. Perception is reality and the VFW and Auxiliary have made major strides in the last several years to try to change the perception of what our communities think we are all about. Many members of the community still view the VFW as that smoky bar where veterans sit telling old war stories.

With the intention of increasing our membership and promoting our Programs we need to become a positive presence in our local communities. Form a **partnership** with another organization to help make their event successful. Remember you cannot plan the event or give money to the event. You are simply there to volunteer your time. For example, if you volunteer at a Relay for Life event, your walk in the relay is not reportable, however you registering walkers or passing out water to walkers is reportable. If you give blood during a blood drive, that is not Auxiliary Outreach, however if you register donors and work the event with the Red Cross that is Auxiliary Outreach.

There has been some confusion since this Program began. Seasoned members remember the days we had Community Service, but this is **NOT THE SAME**

PROGRAM. Think of it this way, it is not volunteering for, but rather volunteering with. It is a donation of time, not money. The goal is work hand-in-hand with other organizations, getting our members out there while you wear something that says Auxiliary.

Here are a few basic steps in making your Auxiliary Outreach Program successful.

- Find local groups and organizations in need of assistance, ask what your Auxiliary can do to help.
- Discuss the project and vote at your meeting to accept your volunteer hours. Some organizations you partner with may have ongoing activities so you would just need to make a motion at the start of the year for that, others have events they plan in advance so that would need a motion for each new event.
- Form the partnership, at least one Auxiliary member needs to work the event.
- Wear your Auxiliary attire (shirt, hat, name badge, lanyard, jacket)
- Report the details, remember only report what doesn't fit under any other Program.

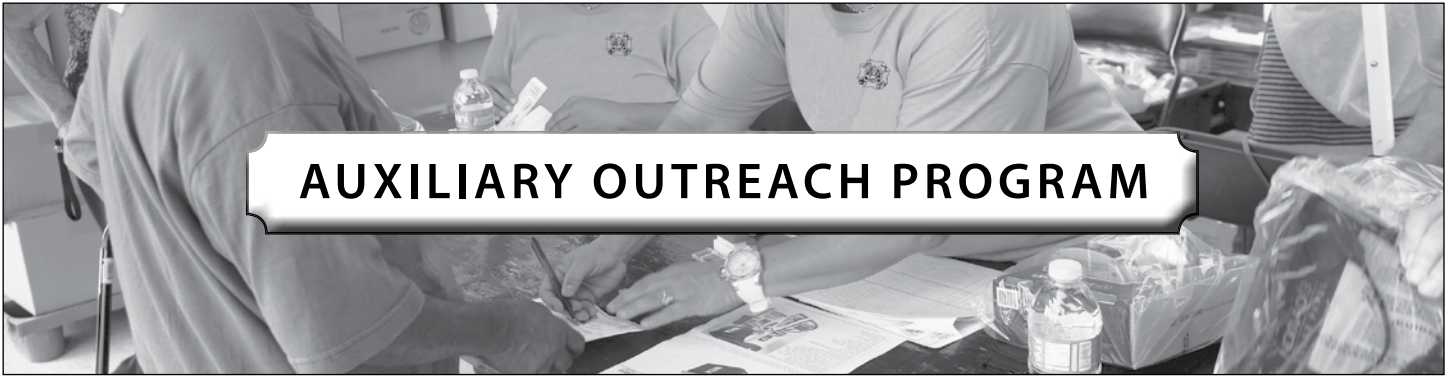
Finding partnership opportunities:

- Ask your members: most of us belong to numerous organizations. Don't forget to reach out to your members who aren't able to attend your meetings, they may want to partner with an organization and report their hours to you.
- Prepare a letter of introduction and send it to all groups or organizations in your community. Let them know who we are and what we do. Invite them to reach out to us if they need volunteers for any upcoming events.

AUXILIARY OUTREACH PROGRAM

Building Partnerships • Auxiliary Participating in Outreach

Auxiliary Outreach is partnering with organizations for the benefit of your community or its institutions. It is a donation of time, not in-kind or monetary donations. Auxiliary Outreach can enable VFW Auxiliaries to engage with their local communities, learn about their needs and collaborate to address them.

Auxiliary Outreach can:

- Be performed by people of any age, skill set or ability level.
- Benefit any group of people such as children, senior citizens and those with disabilities.
- Benefit animals, the environment and public spaces.
- Be done in communities of all types and sizes – rural, suburban and urban, small and large.

We partner to make a difference in our community, but we also receive benefits including:

- Helping others
- Learning new skills
- Meeting new people
- Developing a stronger sense of purpose
- Personal growth

Boost Visibility

Be visible and show your pride in the VFW Auxiliary by wearing Auxiliary-branded attire when you participate in Auxiliary Outreach. A shirt, jacket or hat with the Auxiliary emblem can start a conversation about the Auxiliary and what we do. It is also a great way to show members out volunteering in our communities and not just in our Post Homes.

Reporting

While emphasis is placed on our core VFW and Auxiliary Programs, we realize Auxiliaries also participate with other community organizations. Auxiliaries can now report and be recognized for such community work through the Auxiliary Outreach Program. Projects may be done by the Auxiliary alone or with the VFW Post. Collectively, all our volunteer hours need to be counted to effectively show the importance of the local VFW and VFW Auxiliary to the community.

Outreach and the VFW Auxiliary

When an Auxiliary partners with an organization outside our own, it should be considered Auxiliary Outreach if the project was approved by the Auxiliary and recorded in the meeting minutes prior to the project.

On rare occasions, such as a natural disaster or emergency community need, the project may be voted on after the fact. (When the Auxiliary votes to partner with another organization and only one member is able to show up, it still counts as Auxiliary Outreach.)

See the next page and MALTA Member Resources for examples of what does and does not qualify for Auxiliary Outreach.

Auxiliary Outreach is for projects NOT AFFILIATED with VFW or VFW Auxiliary Programs.

Volunteer work that is performed for the benefit of the Post or Auxiliary is NOT considered outreach service.

QUALIFIES

Spending time in a local homeless shelter kitchen serving meals, bussing tables or cleaning up.

Partnering with the police or fire department on bicycle or home safety training class.

Your Auxiliary approves helping a local cancer group set up their event or manning a booth.

Partnering with the garden club to clean up local parks.

Help a youth group collect food donations for the local food pantry.

DOES NOT QUALIFY

Taking comfort items to the local USO.

Donating trophies to a youth sports group.

Hosting a luncheon/dinner for a local organization.

Sending an Auxiliary check to support a charity that organized a walk-a-thon or run.

Collecting clothing and comfort items for homeless veterans at the Post Home. (This would be Veterans & Family Support.)

Passing the collection basket at church services.

AUXILIARY OUTREACH PROGRAM AWARDS

Awards for Auxiliaries:

1. Most outstanding Auxiliary Outreach activity and/or event that is shared on social media using #AuxiliaryOutreach.
 - Citation and \$25 to one VFW Auxiliary in each of the 10 Program Divisions that shares the most outstanding Auxiliary Outreach activity and/or event using #AuxiliaryOutreach during the current Program Year.

Entry form is required and available in MALTA Member Resources.

From the shining lighthouse we want to honor the dead by helping the living. This is done by distributing "Buddy"® Poppies within our communities; donations collected are used to aid veterans, service members and their families who are in need. While the Cross of Malta is a recognizable symbol of our organization, the "Buddy"® Poppy is a symbol that reminds Americans of the sacrifices made by our veterans while protecting our freedoms. This small red flower, inspired by the John McCrae poem "In Flanders Fields," has been adopted by veterans' organizations around the world as a reminder of what our veterans have sacrificed. There are now two options for the "Buddy"® Poppy; they are the traditional "Buddy"® Poppy and the VFW also has a metal "Buddy"® Poppy that is available. This new metal Poppy is nice for a collar or suit jacket.

History of the "Buddy"® Poppy

Distributing Poppies dates back more than a century, when it became the VFW's official memorial flower in 1922.

While you are distributing Poppies, you can hand out VFW National Home brochures and explain that this is one of the Programs supported by their donations. The "Buddy"® Poppy and VFW National Home go hand in hand!!

Here are some important things to consider when preparing for your "Buddy"® Poppy distribution:

- Identify potential volunteers within your Post and Auxiliary and gather them together for an informational meeting explaining the purpose of the "Buddy"® Poppy campaign.
- Plan for each volunteer to distribute a certain number of Poppies.
- Determine how many Poppies you should order based on the number of volunteers.
- Choose distribution dates. Memorial Day and Veterans Day are always a popular time, but any time is a good time to distribute this memorial flower.
- Stake out key distribution venues in advance. Choose high traffic areas and determine the number of workers you need to cover the locations. Ideal locations include storefronts, office or factory entrances and recreational areas. Make sure you get permission from the business owners before setting up shop. Post flyers, with permission, around town in key areas such as the post office, coffee shops, gas stations, etc. It will let people know when and where they can get a "Buddy"® Poppy. If your local newspaper has a community calendar section, be sure to let the editor know about two weeks in advance that you'd like to place your Poppy announcement on the calendar.
- Encourage your volunteers to smile and be enthusiastic during the distribution. If they appear friendly, it will project a good image for the VFW and Auxiliary.
- Make sure your volunteers wear their VFW or Auxiliary gear.

- Remind your volunteers that they are not “selling” Poppies but distributing them with the hope of getting donations. If you follow these simple steps, your “Buddy”® Poppy campaign is sure to be a success.

Where to get Poppies?

- Contact your VFW Post to order Poppies. Each “Buddy”® Poppy purchased by a Department for distribution contributes to the following:
 - One (1) cent goes to the VFW National Home
 - One (1) cent goes to the VFW National Headquarters Veterans Service Fund
 - One and a half (1.5) cent goes to the Department’s Veterans Service Fund
- Request the order form from your VFW Department Headquarters at least two to three months (8-12 weeks) in advance of your distribution date.

The “Buddy”® Poppy has been an integral part of the VFW community for 100 years. As the VFW’s official memorial flower, the Poppy represents the blood shed by American service members. It reiterates that we will not forget their sacrifices.

The Poppy movement was inspired by Canadian Army Col. John McCrae’s famous poem, “In Flanders Fields.” Poppies were originally distributed by the Franco-American Children’s League to benefit children in the devastated areas of France and Belgium following World War I.

The VFW conducted its first Poppy distribution before Memorial Day in 1922, becoming the first veterans’ organization to organize a nationwide distribution. In February 1924, the VFW registered the name “Buddy”® Poppy with the U.S. Patent Office. A certificate was issued on May 20, 1924, granting the VFW all trademark rights in the name of Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers. No other organization, firm or individual can legally use the name “Buddy”® Poppy.

Honor the Dead by Helping the Living

These small but mighty memorial flowers have raised millions for the welfare of veterans and their dependents. The Poppy Program also provides financial assistance in maintaining state and national veterans’ rehabilitation and service programs and partially supports the VFW National Home.

How to Order

“Buddy”® Poppy Distribution Tips

“Buddy”® Poppy drives can be hosted at any time during the year – not just Memorial Day and Veterans Day. Try doing one at least once a quarter. If you have enough volunteers, host a monthly Poppy drive.

- Talk to your VFW Post about a joint drive and splitting the proceeds.
- Contact your city/town clerk’s office to see if a permit is required for your distribution event.
- Get permission from the desired distribution location(s) store managers/owners prior to promoting your “Buddy”® Poppy distribution event.
- Make sure all Auxiliary members know the time, day and place of your distribution event.

- Share information about your distribution event with your local paper and on social media. Post flyers in high-traffic areas such as grocery stores, coffee shops, the post office, etc.
- Ask for assistance from youth groups such as VFW and/or Auxiliary youth, JROTC, after-school, Scouts, Young Marines and faith-based clubs.
- Ask volunteers to wear Auxiliary- and/or VFW-branded clothing to both promote the Auxiliary and VFW and connect the distribution of poppies to the organization.
- Remind volunteers they are NOT SELLING “Buddy”® Poppies but DISTRIBUTING them for donations. Never refuse someone a “Buddy”® Poppy because they are unable to donate. A “Buddy”® Poppy honors all veterans.
- See the VFW’s “Buddy”® Poppy Chairman’s Guide for further assistance in setting up a “Buddy”® Poppy drive, as well as other helpful resources. The guide can be found in MALTA Member Resources.
- At the Auxiliary and Post level, all proceeds from Poppy drives are to be placed in the Relief Fund with receipts and expenditures in accordance with the Treasurer’s Guide and the *Podium Edition: Bylaws and Ritual*.
- Distribution of “Buddy”® Poppies should be included in every Auxiliary, District or Department activity including parades, patriotic events, membership drives, bingo or trivia nights, etc.
- There are many creative ways to distribute the “Buddy”® Poppy including window displays, posters, wreaths, remembrance walls, hats, event centerpieces, etc.

VFW NATIONAL HOME

The VFW National Home was founded in 1925 as a place where families left behind by war—mothers and children, brothers and sisters—could remain together, keeping the family circle intact even when their serviceman didn't come home. The VFW National Home serves as a living memorial to America's veterans by helping our nation's military and veteran families during difficult times.

Over the years, the National Home has met the changing needs of America's military and veteran families. Through it all, one thing has remained constant: the National Home's commitment to honor our nation's veterans and service members by providing help and hope for their children and families.

The VFW National Community

The VFW National Home located in Eaton Rapids, Michigan, has helped military and veteran families who need a fresh start. Families can live there rent-free for up to four years and have access to professional case management services, on-site licensed child care, life skills training, tutoring and other educational services, as well as recreational and community service opportunities. The National Home's community is open to families of service members, veterans and—recognizing that the effects of war can last for generations—descendants of members of the VFW and the VFW Auxiliary. The family can include one or both parents with one or more children.

Families find healing in a safe and peaceful environment of tree-lined streets with 42 single-family homes and facilities such as a gym, library, computer and science labs, day care center, playgrounds, fishing pond, hiking trails and more.

You can't stop the waves, but you can learn to surf!

The Chief of Staff may serve as the Extension, Revitalization and Mentoring Chairman. So, what is a Department Chief of Staff and how important is this appointment to the success of the Department?

As Chief of Staff, you are the important assistant to the Department President. You should be that extra set of eyes and ears we wish we all had. The Chief of Staff will be a coach, counselor and mentor to all levels of leadership in the Department. They must be knowledgeable in all facets of the Auxiliary including Bylaws, Programs and Mentoring for Leadership.

The Chief of Staff works with the Department President to identify the warning signs of an Auxiliary in trouble before situations occur. The Chief of Staff should be informed of all issues, good and bad, in the Department. The Chief of Staff should train the District Presidents or Official Representatives to recognize Yellow or Red Flag issues early in the Program Year. When they know what a healthy and functioning Auxiliary should be, they can report immediately any concerns to the Department President.

The Chief of Staff has tools available to aid in maintaining strong and healthy Auxiliaries in MALTA. Promote the usage of these resources, such as Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation. Promoting the use of MALTA will lead to more informed members.

The Chief of Staff is instrumental in the success of each Department. Their support assures that goals are attained, Auxiliaries are instituted, members are trained and problems are solved. Healthy Auxiliaries provided better service to our veterans, their families and communities. With the permission of the Department President, the Chief of Staff can assist where needed for the good of the Department.

*From Sea to Shining Sea - Honoring Veterans
Who Keep Us Free*

The VFW Auxiliary was built on a strong foundation based on the traditions established in 1914. With those traditions comes a sincere promise to safeguard the future of the Auxiliary. Each Department President has appointed a Department Chief of Staff to serve with them closely to ensure that Auxiliaries remain strong, enthused and loyal to our organization. These traits allow for the Auxiliary to remain proud, patriotic and energetic, creating members who honor and protect our veterans and their families. Our men and women in uniform have made a similar promise to our nation when they took their oath and promised to safeguard the future of our nation. They remain strong, patriotic and proud, so that we may enjoy freedom. Our foundation is solid – now it is up to us to remain strong.

The Extension & Revitalization Program can benefit every member of the Auxiliary through education. Keeping informed and becoming knowledgeable of our traditions and subsequent Programs will help us to mentor our members and prepare them for leadership roles. This is the heart of what we do in this Program.

Healthy Auxiliaries vs Struggling Auxiliaries

Green Flag - Healthy Auxiliaries

Auxiliaries that are healthy “are good to go.” They have utilized or referred to the Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit found in MALTA. They have met the five (5)

essential requirements for an Auxiliary to be healthy. There are seven resources to assist Auxiliaries in identifying and solving issues within the kit. A Green Flag Auxiliary would be an excellent choice to mentor struggling Auxiliaries.

Yellow Flag - Struggling Auxiliaries

Auxiliaries that are struggling will need mentoring. It is up to the Department Chief of Staff, when requested by the President, to look to assist the Auxiliary. The District President or Auxiliary Representative must be honest in the assessment when completing the visit form after a visit to an Auxiliary. They have firsthand knowledge of the Auxiliary and must communicate any concerns to the Department President and/or Chief of Staff. This situation could be failure to meet any one or more of the five (5) essentials of an Auxiliary, but also a subtle sign such as not attracting new members, failure to complete Programs reports, not assisting veterans and families, no new Officers, or failure to attend District and Department meetings or trainings events.

The completed Official Visit forms should be shared with the Chief of Staff to peruse and perhaps pick up a “Yellow Flag” signal. As soon as struggle is reported, the Department Chief of Staff needs to work closely with the Department President and observe what is happening on the Auxiliary level and be ready to act.

Performance Improvement Plan

The process of arriving at a resolution would be that a Performance Improvement Plan (PIP) is put in place. A PIP Committee (not a suspension committee) is assigned to meet with the Auxiliary President, Secretary and Treasurer and under certain circumstances an individual member or members with the issues to discuss and develop a Performance Improvement Plan. This is the time to **OBSERVE** the Auxiliary and offer **MENTORING**. The President will pick the member or team that fits the Auxiliary – there is no one size fits all. The PIP Committee takes the lead and gradually gets the Auxiliary involved in correcting the issue; thus, the Auxiliary would not have to be put on suspension and the PIP Committee would advise the Department President that the Auxiliary could now be considered healthy. The PIP Committee should be able to attend their meetings and get them back on track. This is a critical time for an Auxiliary and

the spirit of kindness is an absolute must. This is **REVITALIZATION** at its peak.

Red Flag – the Auxiliary will be put on suspension as a time to step back and regroup. Suspension simply means there is some work to do to get the Auxiliary where it needs to be. The hope is that the Auxiliary will recover and come back stronger and better than before.

Extension

We need to make certain that the current Auxiliaries are in good working order. It is also important to make presentations to unaffiliated Posts and when possible, to institute new Auxiliaries. An Auxiliary cannot exist without a Post and there must be a 2/3 vote of the Post to get started. Positive and knowledgeable Auxiliary presenters are important when addressing a Post. The Chief of Staff should be aware of any unaffiliated Post presentations and attend if possible. Always ask the Post Commander for permission to describe the benefits of an Auxiliary to the VFW Post. Extension tools and presentations are available in MALTA Member Resources. Once the Post has approval to establish an Auxiliary, the Department President will appoint an organizer to work with the Post.

Mentoring

Training and educating members to be future leaders is why we mentor. We must ensure that the legacy of the VFW Auxiliary continues through strong and healthy Auxiliaries comprising members who are prepared to take on leadership roles to continue to move the VFW Auxiliary forward. Do not allow Auxiliaries to stay “anchored to the past” – technology is a wonderful tool that gives us the ability to reach so many members, which then allows us to continue the tradition and promise to take care of our veterans and their families. Blend the past with the present to guarantee our future. Mentors are counselors and cheerleaders. Focus on positive attributes and encourage those while offering guidance and training.





EXTENSION & REVITALIZATION PROGRAM

Maintain and Strengthen Current Auxiliaries • Present to Unaffiliated Posts

Establish New Auxiliaries • Recognize Red-Flag Auxiliaries

The Chief of Staff has a critical leadership role in our organization. One of the responsibilities of the Chief of Staff is to provide guidance and resources to VFW Auxiliaries so they can ensure that Auxiliaries are healthy and successful.

Chiefs of Staff work with District Presidents and the Department President to maintain current Auxiliaries. They encourage members, promote teamwork and provide guidance during challenging times such as suspension, consolidation or even the loss of a Charter. Chiefs of Staff also work closely with their Department President and organizers to establish new Auxiliaries.

5 Essentials of an Auxiliary

The National Organization requires only five (5) things of an Auxiliary:

1. Auxiliaries should have at least ten (10) business meetings per year. Five (5) members in good standing (of that Auxiliary) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
2. Dues should be paid by at least ten (10) members on or before February 1 of the current year.
3. Quarterly audits by Trustees must be submitted.
4. Officers elected, installed and reported to National Headquarters no later than June 30. This generates the bond application via email.
5. The offices of President and Treasurer MUST be bonded by August 31.

Establishing New Auxiliaries

Whether a VFW Post decides on its own it wants an Auxiliary or whether an Auxiliary member or non-member sees the potential for a new one, the steps for creating an Auxiliary are the same.

1. A VFW Post must vote by 2/3 majority to have an Auxiliary. (An Auxiliary can never exist on its own without a Post and can never be started without that Post's permission.)
2. The Department President appoints the official organizer of that Auxiliary, and the organizer must be a member of the Auxiliary.
 - It would help to allow two others who are knowledgeable with Auxiliary business and work well with others to be on an organizing team. They can answer questions and assist with training, educating and mentoring the new Auxiliary once it is instituted. It is recommended that the organizer and the organizing team work with the Auxiliary and its members for at least a year, or until they are ready to proceed as an Auxiliary in good standing.
3. A minimum of 15 eligible applicants must be on the Charter application. Transfers are accepted at the closure of the institution and just prior to the installation of the newly-formed Auxiliary.

The Department Chief of Staff could assist by providing the following tools for the organizer and organizing team:

- Talking points for the first meeting.
- A procedure for membership applications.
- When and how to collect dues.

- Assist in securing and filling out official and proper paperwork.
- See that deadlines and filings are met in a timely manner.

Recognize new VFW Auxiliaries

Recognize new VFW Auxiliaries at District and Department functions to help them feel welcome and important.

Maintaining Current Auxiliaries

The National Organization has developed many resources for members to use, including tools available in MALTA Member Resources. These resources have proven to be valuable tools in helping Auxiliaries be more productive.

1. The Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit includes seven (7) resources to assist Auxiliaries in identifying and solving issues including the Healthy Auxiliary Checklist, Auxiliary Meeting Clinic and more.

2. *Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation* makes every effort to educate members on all aspects of the duties of Officers at all levels, how to be a Chairman, the why of reporting and more.

3. Saving an Auxiliary may be achieved by recruiting new members. Work with your Membership Chairman to help an Auxiliary become Healthy. (No new members = a true Red Flag)

Mentoring and Encouraging Members

- Mentoring helps broaden leadership skills and leadership provides guidance for mentoring members; they work hand in hand.
- A stronger membership on every level of our organization will be accomplished through mentoring.
- Through the mentoring process, extending the hand of friendship to a new member or even a tenured member who has been inactive for a while can create a strong and vibrant organization. Providing a positive and organized meeting experience will leave members wanting to come back, especially when effective communication and respect for each other is demonstrated.
- Over time, a member may express interest in holding an office or chairmanship. Work with them to help them succeed. This will only make the Auxiliary and the organization better. Choose the mentor carefully.
- The real goal here is to train your replacement and give them the tools they need to succeed.

The Department Chief of Staff must sign and send a copy of the completed Department nomination form to the National Chief of Staff by April 30, 2026 for judging.

Winners will be announced and awards will be presented at the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Awards for Departments and Department Chairmen:

1. \$25 VFW Store gift certificate to one Department Chief of Staff in each of the 10 Program Divisions for the most unique promotion educating members to maintain healthy VFW Auxiliaries and to promote Extension while utilizing MALTA Member Resources.

Winners will be announced and awards will be presented at the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah.

2. The Outstanding Performance Award and Second-Place Outstanding Performance Award will be awarded in each of the 10 Program Divisions based on the criteria listed on page 5 and for the promotion of the Program goals listed at the top of page 27.

Embrace the Waves of Change

While tradition and history are revered in our organization, it's equally important that we find a way to look forward and ahead. While those tried-and-true methods of the traditional media outlets are still reliable and important to utilize, we must also realize that social media outlets are the way of the future.

We must remember that the future can learn from the past just as much as the past can learn from the future!

If we aren't sharing the stories of our Auxiliaries by using as many means of media as possible, including both traditional and social/digital, then those are missed opportunities for us all! We must continue to do our part to grow the Auxiliary as a whole.

Media

Social media platforms are the BEST (and fastest) way to get the word out about our Programs, our Auxiliaries and what we do for both our veterans and their families. Many of our seasoned members utilize Facebook while many of our younger members prefer Instagram. So, what is stopping your Auxiliary from utilizing these two social media platforms? Did you know that those two platforms can "talk" to one another, and you can cross-post to both platforms by linking your two profiles together?

Communication through traditional media outlets is also important. This includes our newspapers, TV, radio and newsletters.

It's so important to keep our current members up to date on what's happening with our Auxiliaries! Newsletters (both digital emails and printed) are a fantastic way to spread the information about what's happening at your Post and around your communities. Keep in mind that not everyone has an email address, and that is OK. So, what can you do to spread the word and connect with your membership?

- **PREPARE** a monthly or quarterly newsletter to be both mailed and emailed out for your members. Also include some copies at your Post home as well!
- **RECOGNIZE** those members who are celebrating birthdays, anniversaries, volunteer work, etc. Include dates of upcoming events!
- **UPDATE** your Auxiliary/Post Facebook page(s) regularly

Reels

This year, I would love to focus on Auxiliaries using and creating Reels to spread the word about our Programs and what you're doing in your communities! I bet you're thinking to yourself, "What the heck is a Reel?"

- Reels are full-screen vertical videos up to 90 seconds long. They feature a suite of editing tools and audio tracks, as well as trending voice/sound snippets. Reels allow you to add captions, stickers, and backgrounds; upload multiple video clips; use a range of filters and loads more!
- Reels can be made up of a single video, several clips edited together, still photos or some combination of photos and video. Reels can be posted to both Instagram (which has more than 1.3 billion users!) and Facebook. Reels have outstanding visibility and usually appear at the top of your feed.

- Descriptions and hashtags should be used for the Reels as well and those are easy to add.
- Visit MALTA Member Resources, Historian & Media Relations, to read about how to create a reel.

Department Historians & Media Relations Chairmen

Documentation of the National President's Official Visit to the Departments is a very important responsibility for the Department Historian. Each Department Historian should submit to me a slide show presentation (this can be done in PowerPoint, Keynote or Google Slides) including the following:

- A minimum of five (5) photos of the National President during her visit to your Department.
- A maximum of 10 slides may be used and should tell a story of events, fundraisers, meetings and ceremonies that take place throughout the year.
- All photos should be clear and not blurry.
- All slide show presentations should be emailed to the National Ambassador, shared via Google Drive or OneDrive, or submitted via snail mail on a flash drive to the National Ambassador. Must be received by the National Ambassador by April 30, 2026.





HISTORIAN & MEDIA RELATIONS PROGRAM

Historian Duties • Media Relations

The member responsible for Historian & Media Relations duties is a memory keeper, and collector of the five Ws: the who-what-where-when-and-why of your Auxiliary. These individuals compile and chronicle memories and events in written and digital formats, including photographs, memorabilia, print news, audio and/or video clips and social media posts. The Historian & Media Relations member captures the narrative of the Program Year. At the Auxiliary, District and Department levels, these members are the people who get the word out about the Auxiliary to our communities.

The Historian & Media Chairman is also the member who gets the word out about the VFW Auxiliary to our communities. They inform the public about activities, events and our valuable National Programs.

Auxiliary and District Historian & Media Relations

This member keeps a written report of the history of their Auxiliary or District and submits this to their respective President at the end of the year. Supplemental material can include photographs and newspaper clippings that document special Auxiliary events.

Department Historian & Media Relations

This member keeps a comprehensive record of the Department President's activities, and should include travels, Official Visits and other official functions. Collect material in written form to capture your Department's history in chronological order. As with the Auxiliary Historian & Media Relations Chairman, this position also compiles photographs and newspaper and/or video clips of Auxiliary news.

The Department Historian & Media Relations member also documents and photographs the National President's visit and may reach out to local media outlets to organize interviews and news opportunities for the National President.

National Historian & Media Relations

This member documents the travels and activities of the National President. Department-level reports and photos are essential for this job.

What's newsworthy?

Consider these questions: Does it involve local people? Does it interest non-members? Is it timely? Does it help the community? Is it unique and new? If the answer is yes, this is a chance for you to pitch a story with an "angle" that will showcase your Auxiliary's hard work and accomplishments. Let's show our communities, and our nation, everything we do to improve the lives of veterans, service members and their families.

Who Should you Contact About Auxiliary News?

Learn the names of reporters who cover stories most similar to yours and tailor your own list of media contacts. Send information directly to these contacts rather than the editor. News staff who specialize in relevant areas, like society and calendar page editors, are more likely to be receptive to including Auxiliary events. Feel free to send a reporter or editor a personal email and be sure to include your contact information.

Some other ideas include:

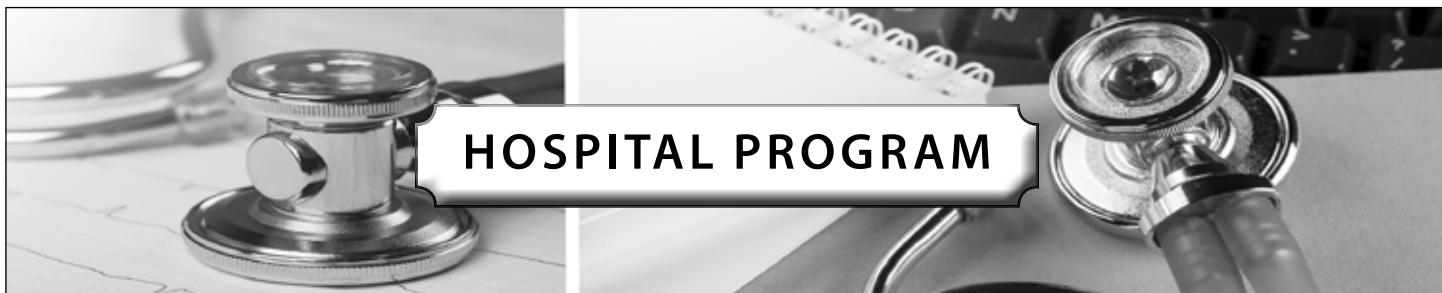

Volunteer Recruitment, Recognition and Support

VFW Auxiliary members have been volunteering in hospitals and medical facilities since the organization's inception in 1914. The Hospital Program was one of the first nationally adopted Programs for the organization. This Program plays an important role to provide care and compassion to veterans while helping them feel included and appreciated.

Who Can Volunteer?

Members, non-members, youth and families can volunteer in many different types of facilities under this Program. They include local hospitals, veterans' homes, nursing homes, both VA and non-VA medical facilities and clinics.

Who Can Serve?

Members, non-members, youth and families.

What Can We Do?

Volunteer opportunities are based on the facility where you are volunteering. Some facilities will have a volunteer program in place with specific jobs, events and needs. Many facilities will have a variety of opportunities to suit different ages and abilities. Be sure you follow all the guidelines given by that facility and regularly ask how you can assist them.

Volunteer Recruitment, Recognition and Support

New volunteers are needed every day across the country. Volunteers offset millions of dollars in expenses in health care. They help create a friendly and caring atmosphere no matter where they volunteer. Here are tips for recruiting and keeping volunteers:

- Provide a monthly sign-up sheet for regular events.
- Email and phone call volunteers for special events.
- Offer public recognition of current volunteers.
- Be specific about what volunteers will be doing, including the time commitment.
- Find out how each person communicates best, whether by phone, email, Facebook or texting.
- If someone says "no" to the first invitation, be sure to ask again!

Lighting the way between veterans' families and legislators with a wave of gratitude.

*Thank You for Your Service –
Turning our Gratitude into Action*

Every time we say, “**Thank you for your service,**” we are acknowledging the sacrifices made by veterans and their families. But we can go beyond words and translate gratitude into action. Our Legislative Program empowers us to advocate for policies that improve the lives of veterans, service members and their families by turning our appreciation into meaningful legislative advocacy.

Consider lighting the way between veterans' families and local legislators by facilitating roundtable discussions, veterans' families could share their experiences and legislators could learn firsthand about the impact of legislation on veterans and their families' lives. These discussions are not only about advocacy but also about ensuring our legislators understand that behind every policy is a story of service and sacrifice.

Follow up with Gratitude

After in-person meetings with local legislators, follow up with an email or thank-you card. The thank you could include a QR code linking to a video of veterans from your community affected by those policies. This will reinforce the impact of the discussion and keep the advocacy message alive.

Legislative “Gratitude Days”

Establish specific days of action where Auxiliaries commit to contacting legislators with a message of thanks, while also urging them to support legislation that benefits veterans.

- Think about key dates, such as Veterans Day, Memorial Day, Vietnam War Veterans Day, Armed Forces Day, or the birthdays of the U.S. Military Branches.
- Include social media campaigns and community engagement.
- Include the youth in your activities.

Thank-You Notes with a Purpose

Host a note-writing campaign where handwritten thank-you notes to veterans are paired with QR codes or links that direct recipients to the VFW Action Corps Weekly sign-up page or the VFW Priority Goals. This can add a layer of engagement, turning gratitude into action. Veterans in the community will feel appreciated, and they will be empowered and engaged with ongoing legislative efforts. Connecting this activity to a community veterans recognition event is one of many ways to reach our veterans.

Veteran Advocacy Training

Prepare Auxiliary members to become powerful voices in legislative advocacy. Organize training workshops for members, teaching them advocacy skills and strategies for engaging lawmakers.

- Use MALTA Member Resources, Legislative.
- Utilize online tools and resources from your local and state government.

- Educate members about how we are non-partisans; we support legislation that improves the lives of veterans and service members.
- When joining the VFW on Capitol Hill during the Legislative Conference in D.C., always allow the VFW to take the lead when speaking to our legislators.
- Open the Action Corps Weekly, lack of activity will result in removal from the mailing list.
- Push the button on Action Alerts from the VFW.
- Use the VFW Auxiliary Legislative hashtag #AuxLegislative.

1. \$25 VFW Store gift certificate to one Department Legislative Chairman in each of the 10 Program Divisions with the largest increase in the use of the VFW Action Alerts and new VFW Action Corps Weekly sign-ups from July 1, 2025 through April 30, 2026.

Winners will be announced and awards will be presented at the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah.

2. The Outstanding Performance Award and Second-Place Outstanding Performance Award will be awarded in each of the 10 Program Divisions based on the criteria listed on page 5 and for the promotion of the Program goals listed at the top of page 41.

Our Auxiliaries are the lighthouses in the ocean that cover a large area. The ocean can be calm as well as rough. When our membership is prospering things are calm. When membership is down, we face rough times. Tides and waves come in different sizes; Auxiliaries come in all different membership sizes.

Having a strong membership base is what draws someone to become a member of that organization. Our membership is the core of our organization. As members, we have the responsibility to help the families of our veterans and foster true patriotism. To make sure that our elected government officials both locally and nationally stand up for our veterans and their families.

Recruiting New Members

How are we going to carry out what our organization was chartered to do? By recruiting new members and assuring our current members stay a vital part of our Auxiliary. If you look at the VFW membership number versus the Auxiliary, we can do better. We joined to give **Honor to our Veteran(s).**

We have an easy tool to figure out who is eligible by using the Membership Eligibility Wheel. It's quick because the wheel shows family members

who qualify to join. Your prospective members may have question about the Auxiliary. We have a quick solution. Almost everyone has a smartphone or tablet with them or within reach. Our newest Membership tool is our QR code (located at the end of my Program page). All your prospective members will need to do is scan the QR code, which will direct them to the VFW Auxiliary website. They will be welcomed with a history of our Auxiliary. As they scroll, they will come upon a downloadable Fact Sheet, Membership Application and Membership brochure. They will then be able to enter their location to find an Auxiliary nearest to them.

In MALTA, find a fillable and downloadable business card template that Membership Chairmen, or anyone who wants to assist with recruiting, can fill out, download and print. The recruiter could give the business card to the potential member. Always remember to gather the name and contact information of the potential member for follow up within two weeks. Remember to sign the application, so you get credit for recruiting the member. The application goes to the Investigation Committee to confirm the candidate's eligibility. Auxiliaries have several members trained in the applications review process. Remember that a VFW member can also recruit an Auxiliary member. They are also given credit for recruiting that member.

I'd like every Department, District and Auxiliary Officer to ask their VFW counterpart if their spouse and family members are members. If they are not members get them to join. Here are some ways to recruit new members.

- Joint VFW/Auxiliary open house
- Exclusive Membership drives
- State/County fairs (with prior approval)
- Patriotic gathering (with prior approval)
- Newspaper article
- Partner with your Program Chairmen from Extensions & Revitalization, Youth Activities, Scholarships, etc.

Retaining Members

We also have a responsibility to retain our current membership. Each member we have has something to contribute to our existence. Sometimes our members may experience a time in their lives where they face a financial concern. When this occurs, our seasoned members may delay paying their dues or even forget. We get it, but we do not want to lose these valuable members. We can assist these members in several ways. Consider adopting this member and paying their dues. Consider having a fundraiser or raffle in your Department, District or Auxiliary which will be used to pay dues or purchase a Life Membership for a member or members. The ultimate way of keeping a seasoned member is member-to-member(s) gifting. Remember, if you choose to pay for a member or members, this must be voted on by the Auxiliary or included in the standing rules, i.e., the standing rules state that Auxiliary 1234 will pay dues for every member age 85 and older. These are just a few ways to retain membership. Within your Departments, Districts and Auxiliaries, you know what works.

Resources

Utilize the Membership tools you can find on MALTA, they will assist you with recruiting and retaining members. Always remember we Joined to **Honor Our Veteran(s)**. When recruiting a new member share a tidbit on your veteran who allowed you to join. My eligibility was a two-step process. The first was my amazing father, PFC Anthony Maruszak, who served in the 8th Army Engineer Corps in the Korean War. My second opportunity came when the Auxiliary allowed males to become members. When recruiting, say your veterans' name as a way of letting the prospective member know you let them live on through you as a proud member of the VFW Auxiliary. Who is your veteran you honor?

Invite New Members • Include Current Members • Invest in the Future of the Organization

The VFW Auxiliary started with a small group of women who wanted to serve veterans; it has grown exponentially and now includes both males and females as members. There is only one way to add members: ask someone to join. And once they join, ask them to participate.

Invite Someone to Join

There are numerous places and times to ask someone if they want to join the VFW Auxiliary. Your approach will look different depending on who your audience is.

In all cases, the potential member should have some knowledge of what the VFW Auxiliary is and what we do before they ever receive an application.

Remember to reach out to your VFW Post members periodically to see if they have family members who may want to join.

What We Do

Our programs are designed to bring needed services, information and assistance to improve the lives of veterans, service members, their families and our communities.

When someone joins the VFW Auxiliary, they will have the opportunity to:

- Support veterans, service members and their families.
- Develop new skills.
- Network and develop friendships.
- Enjoy member benefits.

Follow Up!

The first time you talk to someone new about the organization, that person may not be ready to commit. It's important to ask for their contact information and then follow up within a week.

Include Them in Meetings and Events

The key to keeping members is getting them involved. Call or email a new member within a week with the next meeting date and time, or the next possible event or project. Offer to pick them up or invite them to get coffee before or after a meeting.

Put a team of members in charge of contacting new members or members who haven't been to a meeting recently. The team should be friendly and knowledgeable about the Auxiliary.

Ways to Encourage Participation

- Provide a monthly sign-up sheet for regular events.
- Send emails and make phone calls for special events.
- Public recognition of current volunteers. (Consider posters at your VFW Post Home, if permitted, that spotlight member involvement.)
- Be specific about what they will be doing, including the time commitment.
- Find out how that person communicates best, whether by phone, email, Facebook or texting.
- Have another member stay with them for the entire length of the activity or event.
- If they say "no" to the first invitation, be sure to ask again!
- Plan family-friendly events! Members with children in the home want opportunities to do things with their family.

Invest in the Future

- New members can bring new life to your Auxiliary.
- New members provide additional volunteers.

Have a Plan

Every Department and Auxiliary should have a Membership Plan. This plan should include:

- Contacting current members.
- Reaching out to former members.
- Recruiting events for new members.
- Picking a mentor for a new member.
- Before a membership year begins, set your calendar for these events:
 - o Make it as easy as possible for members to renew their dues. They can renew online in MALTA!
 - o Plan recruiting events in your community each year. This can be done by the Auxiliary or in conjunction with your VFW Post.

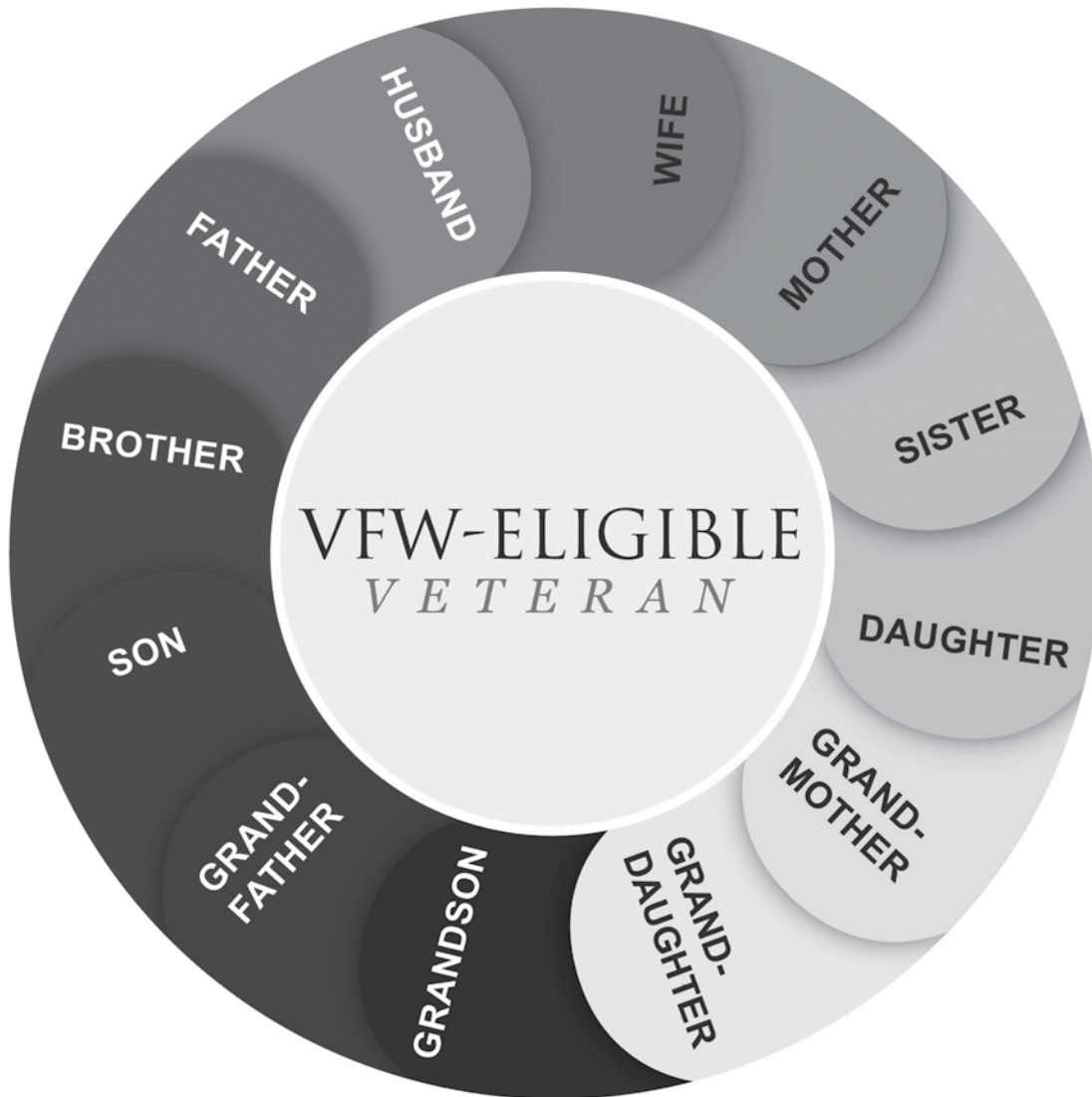

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest and 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest

These two Patriotic Art Contests are open to any student in grades 9-12 who is enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen. Foreign exchange students, students age 20 or older, GED and adult education students or national winners of the same previous Patriotic Art Contests are ineligible. Entries will be judged on patriotic theme and technique.

Scholarships are paid directly to the American college, vocational, technical or trade school of the winners' choice.

The VFW's **National Veterans Service (NVS)** was established to help all veterans, service members, their families and survivors. NVS consists of a nationwide network of VFW Accredited Service Officers and Pre-Discharge Representatives who are experts in navigating VA processes and are the key to your success. VFW Accredited Service Officers are with America's veterans every step of the way once they're ready to file a claim. This is a service the VFW is proud to offer — **FREE OF CHARGE** — to anyone seeking assistance with the claims process.

Pre-Discharge

The VFW Pre-Discharge program was established in 2001 through a cooperative initiative with the Pentagon and the Department of Veterans Affairs. This program ensures separating and retiring active-duty military personnel receive assistance in obtaining their VA entitlements and benefits upon discharge. Pre-Discharge offices are located on or near major military installations across the country.

Military Assistance Program (MAP)

The VFW Military Assistance Program (MAP) is the outstretched hand between the local VFW and military community, offering support around the world. Since 2005, MAP has sponsored events supporting service members and their families.

A large part of MAP is the **Adopt-A-Unit** program, providing VFW Posts with the opportunity to adopt hundreds of military units around the world. Adopt-A-Unit's goal is to develop supportive relationships with units before, during and after deployments to help deliver the vast network of resources the VFW has available to the military. Unfortunately, VFW Auxiliaries will no longer be eligible to request this money. This does not affect the VFW Auxiliaries' ability to request Foundation grants.

Reading Buddies

Be a "Reading Buddy." We sometimes forget that we have many children that are being left behind in schools due to issues concerning reading and comprehension, but if just one person in each Auxiliary could reach out and help a child become a better reader through reading one-on-one or electronically, imagine what an impact we could make in their daily lives and self-confidence. You can use the Patriotism through Literacy reading list in MALTA or talk with the child's parent, teacher or guardian that you have buddied up with to help find out what their interests are, and what reading level books to look for.

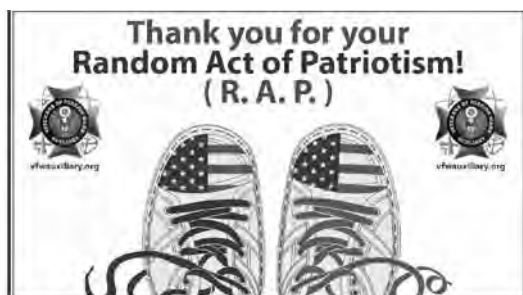

The VFW Auxiliary is in a unique position to help teach our youth the skills to become responsible adults through serving our country, communities and veterans. We have a new generation of veterans who need the support of family, friends and country as they serve overseas and when they come home from conflicts abroad. Today's youth are the future of our nation.

Sponsoring and Working with Youth Groups

As part of the Auxiliary Youth Activities Program, an Auxiliary can sponsor a youth group and engage youth in any one of our Programs, including activities to honor our veterans or assist our service members and their families.

Take advantage of the service aspects some youth groups require. Many youth-focused organizations require various types of community service or activities to earn merits in their units. College-bound seniors earn school credit for some of these same activities.

Remember that involving youth in service to veterans in conjunction with your Auxiliary can bring new membership to your Auxiliary. When youth and the whole family are included, members feel more invested in your Auxiliary. Sponsorship of a youth group can create a bright future for your Auxiliary, veterans and the community as a whole.

Youth Groups Supporting Our Veterans Citations

The Youth Groups Supporting Our Veterans Citation is one way for Auxiliaries to recognize youth groups for their efforts and service projects honoring our veterans and assisting service members and their families. The Youth Groups Supporting Our Veterans

Citation is available in MALTA Member Resources under Youth Activities.

Patriotic Youth Award

The Patriotic Youth Award is designed to recognize individual youth for their patriotism and/or support of our veterans, service members and their families. A fillable, printable version of The Patriotic Youth Award is available in MALTA Member Resources under Youth Activities.

Patriotism through Literacy

Promote and support reading among youth with this simple, fun and potentially free (use your local library) initiative. Introduce youth to historical figures and teach them about events in our nation's history while fostering a love of reading that can lead to a lifetime of learning.

Benefits of Patriotism through Literacy:

- Teach kids about various times in American history. Promote empathy and expose students to experiences unlike their own.
- Foster a love of books that leads to a lifetime of learning.
- Spend time with kids in the community in new, creative ways.
- Help youth gain better understanding of American history through nonfiction.

How can I participate in Patriotism through Literacy?

- Volunteer to read a historical or creative nonfiction picture book to kids at your local library.

- Donate historical fiction or creative nonfiction books to local schools, shelters or libraries.
- Host a read-a-thon and award small prizes (stickers, pins) for number of books or hours read.
- Run a writer's workshop for aspiring teen and tween authors at your Post Home.
- Invite an author of historical fiction or creative nonfiction to do a book talk/signing in your area.

Reading has many benefits, including improved grammar and writing skills, improved focus and concentration, and it helps children to understand and share the feelings of others; reading stretches our imagination. As Dr. Seuss said, "Reading can take you places you have never been before."

Illustrating America

Open to any student in grades K-8 who is enrolled in a public, private or parochial school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen. Foreign exchange students and students age 15 or older are ineligible. National grade division winners of previous Illustrating America contests may enter the subsequent grade division but are ineligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous National winner.

Entries will be judged on patriotic theme and technique. The contest consists of three grade divisions: K-2, 3-5 and 6-8. The Department first-place winner in each grade division will be forwarded to Auxiliary National Headquarters.

There are National awards for first, second and third place in each grade division. The first, second and third place entry in each grade division will be displayed at National Convention.

Contest Rules:

- Entry must be completed during the current school year.
- Entry must be two dimensional.
- Entry must be on canvas or paper.

- Submit canvas entries on a stretcher frame or canvas board.
- Reinforce the back with heavy paper.
- Do not frame art with wood, metal, plastic or glass.
- Mats, including mounted and floating mats, may be used.
- Entries may not be smaller than 8" x 10" and not larger than 18" x 24", **INCLUDING** mat.
- Watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, glitter, marker or other media may be used.
- If the American Flag is used, it **DOES NOT** need to conform to the Federal Flag Code in relation to colors or numbers of stars and stripes.
- Complete the contest entry form and submit it with art entry.
- Parent or guardian signature required on contest entry form.
- **Coloring sheets, digital art and photography are NOT accepted.**
